The morning room, pairing simplicity with elegance, serves a dual purpose: the owner's morning retreat as well as an occasional guest room with the convenience of an attached powder bath. The space benefits from the use of dark taupe walls to create a sense of intimacy enhanced with accents of vibrant red. Because the room is positioned on axis from the home's entry, the designer was mindful to present a vignette with bold visual impact: the vivid red silk window shade frames an antique daybed, abundant with pillows in neutral tones and luxurious textures. The natural Abaca rug subtly complements the woven rugs in the halls and adjacent rooms. The Alsatian-style secretary unites beautiful form with function—providing a practical workspace for the owner and a place where a guest can check email. The large-scale floor lamps of weighted bronze with tree-like bases counterbalance the daybed and echo the room's garden view. The round organic side table adds whimsy with its unusual shape and shiny brass finish—an unexpected touch to the other traditional furnishings.

The powder bath, with low ceilings and confined space, was approached with the utmost care. The colors, textures, and shapes of the morning room are subtly reintroduced. A gentle, almost monochromatic, limestone and travertine mosaic covers the floor. A vanity of dark wood, inspired by an antique table, topped with a modern basin and bronze fixtures, sits beneath metal-shaded French sconces flanked by a round, ebonized antique mirror. Economy of space is enriched by a mix of antique and modern elements.
